## GRANTS

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July, 2016 – CS/SB 230 – Missing Persons with Special Needs Bill approved by the Governor addresses personal safety of persons with special needs who elope (wander) by providing personal safety devices to aid search-and-rescue efforts for such persons and \$100,000 funding for each of three pilot study projects.

In collaboration with FAU College of Business and Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, FAU Center for Autism and Related Disabilities tested the effectiveness of search-and-rescue technology, including unmanned aerial systems, when used in combination with personal safety devices to reduce search and rescue recovery time associated with wandering and elopement cases.

January, 2013 – Autism Speaks \$5,000 Community Service Grant for Project iCAN: Using the iPad to Communicate and Access Needs providing income eligible families with iPads and a communication app. Project focused on coaching parents in navigating, customizing, and using the iPad and app to promote effective communication skills in their children with ASD and included in-home follow-up support to maximize procedural fidelity.

## TEACHING

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### **EEX 4763: Special Education Technology** (*distance learning*) – 2012 to 2016

This course provided undergraduate students with the opportunity to use, design, and apply the principles of Universal Design for Learning for people with a range of disabilities in class and during field experiences.

### **EEX 4937: Gap Course in ABA** (*distance learning*) – 2017 to 2018

As a BACB course that met BACB requirements, this course provided content from the BACB 4th ed. Task List that met the gap in hours for students who previously took the coursework covering the 3rd ed. Task List.

### **EDG 4419: Classroom Behavior Management** (*distance learning & face-to-face*) – 2017 to present

This course provided undergraduate students with an overview of strategies and techniques for organizing and managing classroom settings in the elementary and secondary school settings.

### **EEX 4616: Classroom Management for Inclusive Elementary Schools** (*distance learning & face-to-face*) -2019 to present

This course provided undergraduate students an overview of strategies and techniques for elementary education teachers learning to organize and manage K-5 classroom settings with diverse learning, behavioral, linguistic, and cultural characteristics.

### **EDG 6408: Classroom Behavior Management** (*distance learning & face-to-face*) – Spring 2021

This graduate-level course was designed to prepare educators to meet the needs of all students in diverse, inclusive classrooms and provided teaching strategies for academic and behavior problems, effective discipline, behavioral support, and academic interventions.

**EEX 5612: Applied Behavior Analysis** (*distance learning & face-to-face*) – 2016 to present

As an ABAI approved graduate course for meeting requirements for the standalone concepts and principles content hours, this course provided an introduction to applied behavior analysis with anticipated application to children and youth with exceptionalities, with emphasis on a proactive and positive supportive orientation for reinforcing desirable behaviors and facilitating the acquisition of new behaviors.

**EEX 6095: Nature & Characteristics of Autism Spectrum Disorders** (*distance learning & face-to-face*) – 2015 to present

This course provides graduate-level students working with individuals with autism spectrum disorders (ASD) education regarding possible etiologies, diagnosis, and classification as well as appropriate curriculum, family involvement, and community-referenced behavioral techniques.

**EEX 6210: Diagnosis, Assessment, and Instructional Decision Making in ASD** (*distance learning & face-to-face*) – 2016 to 2020

This graduate-level course informed on the assessment of individuals with autism spectrum disorders (ASD) placing emphasis upon the utilization of assessment results for the purpose of instructional decision making.

**EEX 6298: Interventions for Social, Communication, Academic, and Functional Skills for Students with Autism Spectrum Disorders** (*distance learning & face-to-face*) – 2019 to present

This is a comprehensive course covering effective instructional practices for teaching social, communication, academic, and functional skills to students with autism spectrum disorders (ASD).

**EEX 6626: Behavior Analytic Supervision & Management** (*distance learning & face-to-face*) – 2022 to present

Developed this course to meet BCBA-approved graduate course requirements for the supervision and management content coursework. The objective is to prepare students seeking BCBA certification and special education leadership skills to serve as supervisors for staff disseminating procedures rooted in ABA and related fields.

**EEX 6747: Ethics in ABA** (*distance learning & face-to-face*) – 2015 to present

Developed this course to meet BCBA-approved graduate course requirements for the standalone ethics content hours. The objective is to enhance understanding of ethical & legal issues behavior analysts often face when working in the field, aiming to build capacity for correctly implementing behavior analytic procedures & equipping students with the skills & knowledge needed to become ethically & professionally skilled behavior analysts.

**EEX 6680: Theories and Philosophies in Behavior Analysis** (*developed Fall 2024; first offered and taught Fall 2025*)

Developed this course to meet BCBA-approved graduate course requirements for the standalone philosophical underpinnings content hours. It examines the philosophical foundations of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA), with a focus on B.F. Skinner's writings and other significant historical contributors and aims to develop a deep understanding of the

history and philosophy of behaviorism, theoretical frameworks, and the interpretation of behavior through the core principles of ABA.
