

~~To satisfy the Computer Science (CS) elective requirement, all students~~ All students must take 18 credits of approved elective courses chosen from Computer Science and Computer Engineering upper division courses that are not in the Computer Science Core. Certain 3000-level and 4000-level courses offered by the Electrical Engineering and Computer Science department may be used as Computer Science electives. Certain 5000-level or 6000-level courses offered by the Electrical Engineering and Computer Science department may be taken as CS electives. Students must see an advisor for a current list of elective courses. Students seeking a specialty may consider taking electives in an area of study. A few suggested areas of concentration follow.
