History Course Descriptions

Hitler and Nazi Germany (EUH 4465) 3 credits

After a brief survey of German history from early times to 1933, course focuses on Hitler's rise to power, the politics and policies of the Nazi regime, the road to world war, the Holocaust and the Nazi legacy.

Germany Since Hitler (EUH 4466) 3 credits

This course surveys the key social, economic, cultural and political themes of German history since the defeat of the Nazi regime and the end of the Second World War to the present day. Students will analyze historical evidence and assess media representation to obtain better understanding of post-WWII Germany.

Medieval England (EUH 4500) 3 credits

Consideration of the political, constitutional and institutional development of England from the 5th century to 1485.
